## Bio for Commander John D. Hooper, USCG (Ret)



Commander John Hooper is a native of Chagrin Falls, Ohio and his entire life has been dedicated to serving his country. He is third-generation U.S. Coast Guard with his family's legacy going back to 1867. With family members serving America since 1776 his passion is national security and he has spent his entire adult life as a national security practitioner and educator.
